making the most of your money

If you pay income tax, the church can reclaim the tax you have already paid on your income. This is called gift aid. This means that for every pound you give to the church, we receive an extra 28 pence from the government. This can make a big difference to the income of the church and therefore the more the church can use to fund God's work. Gift Aid is now very flexible, so you need to no longer feel 'locked-in' if your financial circumstances change or you move to a new area.

how is my giving used?

Everything we do at CtK is funded by the gifts of its members and friends. We have no other sources of funding. This is how your gifts will be used.

supporting the ministry team

Our church minister's expenses and other partnership costs are paid for out of the gifts made to the church.

supporting other Christian workers

Throughout the year we have opportunities to support others doing God's work both in this country and overseas. This includes those serving on long or short-term mission projects and relief organisations in their work among the needy.

the church building

We are blessed with a modern building for us to use both for worship and for many other community facing opportunities. Your money goes into a joint purse together with funds from the Catholic congregation to maintain these facilities and its equipment.

other causes

We frequently support emergency appeals resulting from crises in other parts of the world.

other organisations

We are glad to be able to support many local organisations and our local primary school. Some groups are able to use our church premises for their meetings including the Alanon group and the Angel Tree Project. The local primary schools use the church building at special times of the year including their Christmas and Easter festivals.

tithing

We are pleased to be able to tithe our giving, and each year the church council meeting decides on the recipients. This usually includes the overseas work of our founding church organisations and other local and international charities.


from your bank account
