# **Recycling at Christ the King**

As MK council has changed how we recycle in MK we have had to change how we collect recycling in the church. There are now 3 recycling bins in the kitchen which are labelled:

- The blue bin is for clean paper and card only.
- The green bin is for hard plastic, tin cans and glass.
   Do not put broken glass in here.
- The red bin is for soft plastic only. (This is taken to Tesco for recycling)

There is also a blue plastic crate in the foyer for recyclable paper and card only. Volunteers empty these bins, please do not put broken glass in them.

Please note that the bins are not colour coordinated the same as the MK council bins, this is just what we could get. Organic waste such as tea bags, coffee grounds, food waste and dead flowers should go in the smaller green bin outside the kitchen.

Anything that cannot be recycled, like paper towels should go in the cream kitchen general waste bin. Broken glass should be wrapped in newspaper and placed in the cream general waste bin in the kitchen or taken home for disposal.
